Readings

Proverbs 1:20-33

The Call of Wisdom

20 Wisdom calls aloud [a]outside; She raises her voice in the open squares.

21 She cries out in the [b]chief concourses, At the openings of the gates in the city She speaks her words:

22 "How long, you [c]simple ones, will you love [d]simplicity? For scorners delight in their scorning, And fools hate knowledge.

23 Turn at my rebuke; Surely I will pour out my spirit on you; I will make my words known to you.

24 Because I have called and you refused, I have stretched out my hand and no one regarded,

25 Because you disdained all my counsel, And would have none of my rebuke,

26 I also will laugh at your calamity; I will mock when your terror comes,

27 When your terror comes like a storm, And your destruction comes like a whirlwind, When distress and anguish come upon you.

28 "Then they will call on me, but I will not answer;

They will seek me diligently, but they will not find me.

29 Because they hated knowledge

And did not choose the fear of the Lord,

Reflection

I hope you enjoyed the hymn "O Beautiful Gaia" that will be a sort of theme song for the Season of Creation as we sing it each week until Thanksgiving.

Gaia is the ancient Greek God who personifies the earth. It is a name many use to describe the Divine Feminine within creation. She is Mother Earth but so much more than just the conductor of seasons and the grower of gardens, she is the mystery and holiness of all living things upon our planet. Gaia is the consciousness of the world.

In Proverbs, Wisdom is personified as a woman, present at and involved in creation. Wisdom is therefore often identified by the name Sophia. The purpose of this feminine entity in the scriptures differs amongst scholars, as some theologians believe Wisdom is simply a literary device, while others say she represents the Holy Spirit, or possibly even the pre-incarnate Christ. Is Sophia and the Word (from John's gospel) present in the beginning one in the same? No matter which view we take, Wisdom is clearly from God, and accessed both through study of nature and scripture (as described in the Psalm as God's world and Word).

In many ways, Gaia is not all that different from Sophia. Both are seen as feminine and giving birth to creation. They offer balance and harmony in our personification of God, including all traits and gender characteristics. There is a warmth, nurturing and radical welcome present in the image of Gaia cradling our sick, distraught and rebellious planet in her bosom.

In verse 5, the Psalmist says that God set the sun and its celestial siblings within an atmospheric dome or tent. God has created a home for us all, a protective barrier under which all living things dwell here on earth. Though we are sheltered from the vastness of the universe, we have not managed to defend the world from the actions of humanity.

Sophia tells us to love, respect and listen to the world around us but all too often we ignore the well-being of our planet in favor of convenience and "progress" for ourselves. Proverbs seems to be issuing a warning for us

Proverbs clearly outlines how natural disasters will be the consequence of ignoring Sophia. How is climate change effecting your life? How do you listen to the wisdom of Gaia/Sophia? What actions are you willing to make to preserve this home in which we have been gifted?
